SCHOOL PHILOSOPHY

Since a major function of the public school system is to prepare youth for citizenship in a democracy, it is essential that respect for law and order shall be instilled in the minds of every student. In any society, the majority follows their inclinations to be good citizens without compulsion, but there are a few who obey only when it pleases them or when the certainty of punishment acts as a deterrent.

Our first responsibility shall be to train our students in good study habits and attitudes of good citizenship that will cause them to be considerate of the welfare of their fellow students and be law abiding with respect to the rules and regulations of the school and the state.

In order to ensure a quality educational program and a safe and caring school setting, it shall be the policy of the Princeton Joint Unified School District to insist that all students obey all rules. It shall also be the policy of the district to implement the least number of rules necessary.

Princeton Attendance Expectations

The Governing Board believes that regular attendance plays a key role in student achievement. The Board recognizes its responsibility under the law to ensure that students attend school regularly. Parents/guardians of students are obligated to send their children to school unless otherwise provided by law. The Board shall abide by all state attendance laws and may use appropriate legal means to correct the problems of excessive absence or truancy.

Students will be expected to attend class regularly and to be on time in order to receive maximum benefits from the instructional program, to develop habits of punctuality, self-discipline, and responsibility, and to assist in keeping disruption of the educational environment to a minimum. While it is possible for an absent student to make up much of the school work missed, it is impossible to completely compensate for absence from the classroom experience. Consistent attendance in classes in the Princeton Joint Unified School District is crucial to each student's personal and academic growth.

Students who are ill should remain at home. It is understood that there will be occasional family emergencies that may require a student to be out of school. However, parents and students are encouraged to meet all school commitments and to schedule all non-school commitments and appointments outside the regular school day. District procedure provides that given parent authorizations, school personnel may, depending on the circumstances, declare other absences excused or unexcused.

Student and Parent Attendance Responsibilities

- When a student is absent, the parent must notify the school within 24 hours by phone or in writing verifying the cause of the absence.
- Calls should be made to the Attendance Office as early as possible. If a call or written note is not received with 24 hours, the absence becomes truancy. The truancy may be cleared by a note or phone call to the Attendance Office by the parent or guardian. Failure to clear the absence may result in disciplinary action.
- Notes must contain the following information: First and last name of student; Date(s) of absence(s) and a dated parent signature. All notes must be in ink.
- If additional information is necessary to determine absence clarification, the attendance clerk will contact the parent/guardian.

Excused Absences

Student shall be excused from school for the following reasons specified by Education Code:

- Illness
- Medical services
- Funeral for a family member
- Observation of a holiday or ceremony of his/her religion
- College/University, trade school visitation
- An employment conference when the pupil's absence has been requested, in writing, by the parent or guardian and approved by the site administrator
- Jury Duty
- Quarantine
- Other emergency or set of circumstances which, in the judgment of the Superintendent or designee, constitutes a good and sufficient cause for absence from school.

Unexcused Absences

Education Code requires mandatory school attendance. Students with chronic absences will be identified as truants and will be referred to the County Student Attendance Review Board (SARB) for disposition. Teachers may or may not permit make-up work missed due to unexcused absences. Excessive excused absences for medical services will require a physician's note after the 3rd absence.

STUDENT TARDY POLICY

The Board of Trustees of Princeton Joint Unified School District formally approved the following as Board Policy regarding student tardiness at Princeton High School:

1. Students should be in the classroom ready to work when the tardy bell rings. If not, and if there is no pass from faculty, staff, or administration excusing the tardy, it will be recorded as “unexcused.”
2. Students will be allowed to accumulate three (3) unexcused tardies per semester without punishment or comment. A fourth unexcused tardy, and any subsequent unexcused tardy, will draw one hour of after-school detention for each offense.
3. Students will be notified of detentions which must be served following the last period of the day. They will then have one working day in which to serve that detention: that is, a detention may be served immediately following notification, or on the afternoon of the next day.
4. Students who fail to attend a detention will have another added for the following day. There will be no excused absences from detention. Students who miss a second consecutive detention will be cited for willful disobedience, as outlined in the Disciplinary Code.
5. Any student with outstanding detentions due beyond the one day grace period will be placed on social probation until all detentions are served.
6. Students who accumulate ten (10) tardies during a semester even though they may have served all required detentions, will be suspended from school according to the provisions outlined in Step IV of the Disciplinary Code. A suspension of any duration will carry with it an additional mandatory penalty of social probation of five (5) school days.
7. Students who accumulate fifteen (15) tardies during a semester, even though they may have served all required detentions, will be suspended from school according to the provisions outlined in Step V of the Disciplinary Code. A Step V suspension will carry with it, a mandatory social probation of twenty (20) school days.

Selection of Valedictorian and Salutatorian

The following criteria will be used to determine the selections of Valedictorian and Salutatorian in each senior class:

- 1) The selected students must have been enrolled at Princeton High School within the first two weeks of the Senior Year and remain enrolled for the year.
- 2) An earned 3.5 overall GPA is required to be the Valedictorian and Salutatorian.
- 3) All grades earned in High School will be counted up until the end of the 4th quarter of the Senior Year.
- 4) Earned grades from courses taken at a community college or local university may be factored into the overall GPA at the student's discretion.
- 5) Advanced Placement (AP) classes will not be weighted for GPA purposes.
- 6) There may be no F grades on high school transcripts.
- 7) Classes that will not be included in the GPA include P.E and electives, nor any units earned by being a Teacher's Assistant (TA).

If there are no graduating Princeton High School seniors that meet the established criteria, there will be no selection from that graduating class.

DISCIPLINE POLICY

The Board of Trustees of the Princeton Joint Unified School District believes that the conduct of students attending the school must establish an educational climate that is both safe and conducive to the furtherance of educational opportunities for youth and the promotion of learning. All pupils shall comply with the regulations, pursue the required course of study, and submit to the authority of the teachers of the schools. Students who fail to comply with these rules and regulations will be counseled and reprimanded. This discipline policy applies while on school grounds and while going to or coming from school.

DRESS CODE

At Princeton Junior/Senior High School we take pride in the appearance of our school and our students. All students are expected to dress and groom themselves neatly in clothes that are suitable for school activities. Guidelines are as follows:

The following apparel MAY NOT be worn on campus:

- Short shorts, skirts, or dresses (defined as shorter than mid-thigh); shorts or pants should not be so tight as to draw undue attention to the student, no swim trunks, running shorts, or similar type of shorts may be worn.
- T- Shirts cut into tank tops and/or open sided; t-shirts with low cut necks sides; t-shirts may not be worn on the shoulders.
- Open sided shirts.
- Backless, halter, and/or one shoulder type clothing; razor/lace back type shirts and clothes that expose the midriff, and strapless/tube top apparel.
- Clothing with spaghetti straps, swimsuit-type apparel, and/or leotard top clothing
- Exposed undergarments; this includes (but not limited to) see through, mesh, spandex type clothing, and/or saggy pants/trousers.
- Shoes/footwear that is considered sleepwear and footwear deemed unsafe to be worn in shop type classes; shoe skates, i.e. wheelies
- Apparel (including brand name) that displays slogans/pictures that directly or indirectly refer to sex, drugs, crude language, alcohol, weapons, or illegal activities.
- Gang related including bandanas, gang related colors, names or symbols, etc., visible or not.
- Shop/Science Dress Expectations – Refer to teacher guidelines.
- Pants must be worn properly; saggy pants of any kind MAY NOT be worn below the waist; underwear may not be exposed under any circumstances.
- Hats are allowed on campus, with the same restrictions noted above for apparel. Individual teacher rules will dictate whether a hat may be worn in a given classroom.

CELL PHONES

Princeton Joint Unified School District allows students to carry cell phones on campus. Cell phones may be used before school, after school, during passing periods, breaks, and lunch. Phones must be stored out of sight and on silent or vibrate during instructional time, rallies, assemblies and other school activities. The only exception is if a teacher or other staff member directly instructs a student to use his / her cellphone (e.g., as a calculator). Cell phones used during unauthorized times will be confiscated and may require parent / guardian pickup.

BULLYING

The Princeton Joint Unified School District recognizes the harmful effects of bullying on school learning and school attendance and is committed to providing a safe school environment that protects students from physical and emotional harm. No student or group of students shall, through physical, written, verbal, or other means, harass, sexually harass, threaten, intimidate, cyberbully, cause bodily injury, to, or commit hate violence against any other student or school personnel. The definition of “bullying” for purposes of establishing grounds for suspension or expulsion includes bullying via an electronic act on or off campus.

STUDENT BEHAVIOR EXPECTATIONS

Students at Princeton Junior/Senior High School are expected to abide by guidelines for the safety and well-being of all. The first means of addressing student misbehavior is the teacher’s classroom rules. Some of the behaviors listed below have consequences that can be imposed by the teacher and such decisions will be supported by the administration. Some of the other behaviors will be handled by the administration upon the first offense (e.g., arson). The following guidelines address certain behaviors and their possible consequences.

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CANINES ON CAMPUS

It has been established that trained canines are effective in identifying harmful contraband. At the Princeton Joint Unified School District, specially trained canines under the guidance of trained professional dog handlers may be used periodically for the purpose of maintaining a safe environment for our students.

STUDENT DRIVERS / PARKING ON CAMPUS (BP 5131.3)

STUDENT DRIVING AND PARKING

Driving a personal vehicle to school is a privilege extended to students of legal age with a valid California Driver’s License and proof of valid insurance. Students who drive to school must register their vehicle with the school.

The Superintendent or designee shall establish regulations related to student driving and parking authorization. The Princeton Joint Unified School District Board of Education expects all student drivers to comply with the below listed regulations governing student driving and parking, without exception.

Because student driving behavior can directly affect the students’ safety and the safety of others, the following regulations apply:

1. All vehicles used for student transportation shall comply with all vehicle code requirements.
2. Students driving vehicles to school must register the vehicle with the school and receive a school permit to park in the designated parking area(s).
3. Students driving vehicles to school must park in the designated parking area(s).
4. Use of vehicles on school grounds except designated parking areas is prohibited at all times.
5. Students are not permitted to enter the vehicle parking area during class, between classes, or at noon except by special approval of the principal.
6. Students are not permitted to move vehicles during the school day without prior approval from the administration. Once student drivers enter the parking lot, their vehicles must remain parked in the student parking lot for the remainder of the day. Senior drivers who wish to leave campus for lunch are excluded from this rule (see below).
7. Students are expected to obey all traffic laws while driving on the way to and from school and school activities and while on school property.
8. Students are not permitted to drive or ride with other students except as provided for in law.
9. Seniors may leave campus during lunch with signed permission from their parent/guardian. They may not, under any circumstances, transport other students.

SCHOOL BUS RULES, PROCEDURES AND CONSEQUENCES

Transportation is not a right, but a privilege subject to revocation for improper behavior.

Rules and Regulations for School Bus Passengers

- Pupils are encouraged to arrive at their bus stop five (5) minutes before the bus is scheduled to arrive.
- Pupils shall use only their appropriate bus stop.
- Pupils pre-kindergarteners through fifth grade shall leave the bus at their regular bus stop unless they have a note from their parents, approved by the principal or his/her designee, authorizing the pupil to leave the bus at another stop.
- Pupils shall avoid fighting, pushing, or rough play of any kind while at the bus stop, on the bus, or when loading or unloading from the bus.

- Pupils shall respect the rights and property of others on the bus and at all bus stops.
- Pupils shall not use profane language, obscene gestures, or create excessive or unnecessary noise that would distract the driver’s attention.
- Pupils shall not throw objects inside or out of the bus.
- Pupils shall sit up in their seats, face the front of the bus, keep their feet off the seats, and not obstruct the aisle with legs, feet, or other objects.
- Pupils shall not change seats while the bus is moving, or leave their seats until the bus is stopped and the doors are open.
- Pupils shall keep all parts of the body inside the bus windows and emergency exits at all times.
- Pupils shall not damage or deface any part of the bus, tamper with the radio, bus controls, or emergency exits.
- Pupils shall not use any tobacco products, nor eat or drink on the bus. (On student activity trips ONLY, the bus driver may allow student to eat or drink on the bus.)
- Pupils shall not bring live animals, except service dogs, on the bus.
- Pupils shall obey the instructions of the driver at all times.
- We will not transport hazardous or destructive objects of any kind, such as firearms, weapons, glass objects or containers, explosives, sharp or pointed objects, skateboards, scooters, ball bats, or any other large toys.
- Seat belts must be worn if bus has seat belts.
- Every school bus and driver has been supplied with a “School Bus Incident Reporting System” which reflects the rules of student conduct. If your child is reported for any of the above instances, the principal will usually take the follow disciplinary action:

First Offense:	A warning to the student with a report to the parents. It is hoped that the parents will help to prevent a reoccurrence.
Second Offense:	The rider will be denied transportation services until a parent conference is held with the principal, parent and bus driver.
Third Offense:	The rider will be denied transportation services for a period of two weeks.
Fourth Offense:	The rider will be denied transportation services for a period of three weeks.
Fifth Offense:	The rider will be denied transportation services for the remainder of the school year.

The principal and/or designee is responsible for investigating reports for misconduct, determining, and enforcing the penalty that a rider will receive for his/her misconduct on the bus.

Search and Seizure

Princeton school officials may search any individual student, his/her property, or district property under his/her control when there is a reasonable suspicion that the search will uncover evidence that he/she is violating the law, Board policy, administrative regulation, or other rules of the district or the school.

The types of student property that may be searched by school officials include, but are not limited to, lockers, desks, purses, backpacks, student vehicles parked on district property, cellular phones, or other electronic communication devices.

When necessary, the Superintendent or designee, may use metal detectors, detection canines, or a Breathalyzer to help ensure a safe and orderly school environment.

The Superintendent or designee shall notify the parent/guardian of a student subjected to an individualized search as soon as possible after the search.

SCHOOL-PARENT PARTNERSHIP COMPACT

8. Stay informed about my child's education and communicating with the school by promptly reading all notices from the school or the school district either received by my child or by mail and responding, as appropriate.
9. Serving, to the extent possible, on policy advisory groups, such as being the Title I, Part A parent representative on the school's School Improvement Team, the Title I Policy Advisory Committee, the District-wide Policy Advisory Council, the State's Committee of Practitioners, the School Support Team or other school advisory or policy groups.

Princeton Student Responsibilities

We, as students, will share the responsibility to improve our academic achievement and achieve the state's high standards.

1. Attend school each day school is in session.
2. Attend all classes on time.
3. Follow all school rules.
4. Maintain appropriate behavior at school.
5. Do my homework every day and ask for help when I need it.
6. Read at least 30 minutes every day outside of school time.
7. Give my parents or the adult who is responsible for my welfare all notices and information received by me from my school every day.
